ABOUT US

The Northern Ohio Youth Orchestra is a regional orchestral training program that attracts gifted young musicians ages 8-22 from a geographic area spanning Toledo to Cleveland. Our musicians rehearse weekly at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music under the direction of a distinguished staff of musicians. They explore classical, romantic, contemporary, and world music repertoire through three distinct performing ensembles: the Symphonetta Strings, Philharmonia Orchestra, and Rhythm & Brass. Our musicians may compete in our annual concerto competition and participate in guest master classes. They routinely commission and perform new works, tour, perform side-by-side with peer orchestras, and collaborate with guest artists.

At the conclusion of another excellent season, I am inspired by the talent and dedication shown by the young artists of NOYO. I am proud to be part of a program that offers students quality musical experiences, and challenges them to achieve goals that they may not have thought possible.

Our 47th season was a continuation of the rapid growth we have been experiencing over the past three years. We have been reaping the rewards of the board's decision in 2014 to appoint our first full-time executive director, Michael Roest. With the increased staff time, our outreach and recruitment efforts continue to grow, resulting in new programming and quality instruction for all our students.

In the past year, the board has worked diligently to implement our strategic plan. We worked with our governance committee to create a code of conduct for our students, updated board by-laws, and provided cost of living wage increases for our administrative staff members. Relationships were formed and strengthened by holding an after concert reception with local private and school music teachers. Our year end gala event "A Toast to NOYO" was a tremendous success. We showcased performances by faculty members of the Oberlin Conservatory as we celebrated NOYO at Biermarkt in Ohio City. Attendance for the event was up 43% this year, which helped contribute to a 45% increase in raised funds. We are looking forward to continuing the trend as we begin to plan our gala fundraiser for April 2017.

Everything you will see in this report demonstrates the incredible dedication of our artistic and administrative staff. With their hard work, the mission of NOYO continues to grow as we reach more young people in our community. The coming season includes new programs, and we look forward to celebrating another successful year.

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As I look back on our 2015-2016 season, I see a year of exceptional artistic and organizational growth. In just a year's time, we doubled our concert attendance and significantly increased individual and foundation support which enabled us to expand our programing and perform concerts at an extraordinarily high level. Congratulations and thank you to all of our gifted young musicians and incredibly supportive families, teachers, and community members. I would like to highlight a number of projects that helped define our 47th season and made the year a success.



We debuted our Young Composers Program and Chamber Music Extension at the BOP STOP in Cleveland with premiere

performances of NOYO student compositions and chamber music ensembles. The Young Composers Program provided students with year-long composition instruction at Oberlin Conservatory with conservatory student composers Torrin Hallett and Justin Weiss. Over the course of the year and with the guidance of composer Aaron Helgeson, students learned the fundamentals of music—including counterpoint, notation, and instrumentation—while expressing themselves in their own compositions. Student works were premiered by Oberlin Conservatory musicians at the BOP STOP alongside NOYO chamber music ensemble performances.

Our season closed with "A Night at the Opera." This star-studded evening of beloved opera arias and broadway hits featured Oberlin Conservatory student and faculty soloists, concerto competition winners violist Natalie Brennecke (Philharmonia Orchestra) and violinist Elena Runion (Sinfonietta Strings) and the cast and chorus of the MAD* Factory's production of *Les Miserables*. It was by far one of the largest concert productions of the season, ending with a standing ovation.

NOYO's inaugural Summer Symphony was a huge success! 36 young string players from Lorain County participated in the weeklong day camp hosted at Oberlin Conservatory. From August 9-16, they rehearsed as a full orchestra under the direction of Peggie Willett, NOYO's Sinfonietta Strings Conductor. Every morning, students ranging from grades 4-9 enjoyed a full day of orchestra rehearsals, coaching sessions, chamber music rehearsal, and social activities. Students worked with expert string teachers from the Oberlin Community Music School who helped them navigate repertoire and develop their technique and musicianship. Summer Symphony had its premiere performance in Kendal at Oberlin's Heiser Auditorium and gave their final performance in beautiful Finney Chapel.

We had ambitious goals going into our 47th season, and I am so proud to say that we not only accomplished them, we exceeded them. Thank you for an incredible year.

During rehearsals, musicians receive instrument-specific instruction and learn the skills needed for ensemble playing with an emphasis on collaboration, proper technique, and musicianship.

The Philharmonia Orchestra is a full symphonic ensemble comprised of winds, brass, percussion, and strings. The orchestra performs three public concerts at Oberlin Conservatory of Music. Under the quidance of professional musicians, the orchestra rehearses and performs challenging orchestral repertoire ranging from classical masterworks to world premieres. The Philharmonia Orchestra's repertoire challenges its musicians to perform at a high precollegiate level. Over the course of the concert season, musicians develop their musicality and leadership skills while collaborating with their peers.

YOUNG COMPOSERS PROGRAM & CHAMBER MUSIC EXTENSION

The Northern Ohio Youth Orchestra debuted its Young Composers Program and Chamber Music Extension at the BOP STOP with premiere performances of student compositions and chamber music ensembles. An exciting new initiative, the Young Composers Program provided students with year-long composition instruction at Oberlin Conservatory under the guidance of Assistant Professor of Composition, Aaron Helgeson and Oberlin Conservatory student composers, Torrin Hallett and Justin Weiss. Over the course of the year, students learned the fundamentals of music composition—including counterpoint, notation, and instrumentation—while writing works which were by Oberlin Conservatory musicians. The concert featured NOYO chamber music ensembles as part of the Chamber Music Extension. Students in this program rehearsed from April to May, learning how to play in small ensembles under the instruction of Oberlin Conservatory students.
